Deaf People and Employment in the United States: 2019

Deaf and hearing people have unemployment rates of 38% and 34%, respectively This difference, while small, is statistically significant This suggests that deaf people are more likely to be actively looking for work than hearing people The largest disparity between deaf and hearing people, however, is that of labor force involve-ment

Clinical and Cultural Issues in Caring for Deaf People

People with hearing loss represent approximately 10% of the US population,¹ but the size of the US Deaf community is difficult to measure Estimates range between 100,000 and 1 million²⁻⁴ Their language, American Sign Lan-guage (ASL), is quite different from English and is the
